In recent days, parishioners have been asking me how I have coped with all the changes in Pastors we have had over the years, but the truth is we have not had very many changes in the 26 years I have ministered here compared with many parishes in our diocese. Don't believe me? Here is a list of all our Pastors since the establishment of St. Athanasius on June 15, 1959:

Fr. Leonard W. Bose 1959-1969

Fr. John J. Reilly 1969-1976

The Holy Ghost Fathers (Irish Province) are invited by the Archbishop of San Francisco to provide priests to staff our parish. This was prior to the creation of the Diocese of San Jose.

Fr. Kevin McArdle, C.S.Sp. 1976-1979

Fr. Joseph S. Prendergast, C.S.Sp. 1979-1988

Fr. John Cooper, C.S.Sp. 1988-1994

Fr. Diarmuid Casey, C.S.Sp. 1994-2009 (at 15 years, our longest serving Pastor to date)

The Diocese of San Jose begins to provide clergy for our parish after the departure of the Holy Ghost Fathers on June 30, 2009.

Fr. Oscar D. Tabujara 2009-2019

Fr. Walter Suarez, started July 1, 2019

That's only eight Pastors in sixty years, not a huge number for that span of time. Each one of these men brought their own unique spiritual gifts, talents and personalities to our community and together with the other clergy, lay staff and, most importantly, the faithful parishioners, have helped create the parish of St. Athanasius we experience today. I thank Fr. Oscar and Fr. Paul for their service to God and to the people of this parish. May God continue to bless Fr. Oscar in his retirement and Fr. Paul in his new assignment at Our Lady of La Vang parish in San Jose.

For long-time parishioners, such as myself, change can be difficult but it is also filled with hope and excitement. New energy, new ideas, new relationships, adding to what works well, addressing un-met needs, growing in discipleship together as one community of faith. As it states in our Parish Mission Statement --**"St. Athanasius Church's mission is to build disciples of Jesus Christ and assist them in responding to God's call to love and to serve."** Personnel may change but the mission for those who remain stays the same.

Are You a Registered Parishioner?

If you attend Mass here regularly, we encourage you to register as a member of Saint Athanasius Church.

Why is registering important?

1. As a parish we need to know who is out there, so we can serve the needs of all. This includes single people or young families who may not see the need to register.
2. Registering in the parish makes Sacrament preparation easier when the time comes. Infant baptisms, religious education registration, being a godparent/sponsor for baptisms or confirmations, and especially getting married whether you are getting married at this parish, another parish, or having an international Catholic wedding. If you're not a registered parishioner this will greatly delay the process.
3. Letters of Recommendation Sometimes there are occasions where letters of recommendations are needed from your parish pastor (ie Catholic school enrollment, scholarships, godparent eligibility, etc.). If you're not registered, we cannot provide this letter to you or your family. Anyone, regardless of where they live is welcome to register at Saint Athanasius.

Registering is easy! Pick up a Registration Form from church (by the two main entrances), Visit the Parish Office, or email us (Athanasius@comcast.net) to request a registration form.

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Summertime, and the scriptures are full of good news—and maybe even road trips! We hear Isaiah exhorting the Israelites after they traveled back to Jerusalem from their exile in Babylon. We hear the seventy-two disciples congratulating themselves for going out to proclaim the Kingdom and coming back with tales of success. But the subtext of all of this is the ultimate road trip—Jesus' journey to Jerusalem and the Cross.

Imagine how elated the Israelites were, returning from their captivity in Babylon. Even better, the once-destroyed Jerusalem had been restored. Their God had saved them and they were going home. Isaiah, their prophet, assured them of God's loving care for them, comforting, like a mother, giving them abundant cause for rejoicing. Yet how did they travel? The community of Israel went together, supporting each other, but the road must have been hard on them. Their faith and trust in the merciful God of Israel sustained them.



7 de julio de 2019 • Decimocuarto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

El tiempo veraniego y las Escrituras están llenos de buenas noticias y quizá algunos paseos al aire libre. Escuchamos a Isaías exhortar a los israelitas después de que regresaron a Jerusalén de su exilio en Babilonia. Escuchamos a los setenta y dos discípulos felicitarse entre ellos por haber ido a proclamar el Reino y ahora estar de vuelta con historias de éxitos. Pero lo implícito de todo esto es el último viaje, el viaje de Jesús a Jerusalén y a la cruz.

Imagina a los israelitas lo eufóricos que estaban, regresar de su cautividad en Babilonia. Mejor aún, la ciudad de Jerusalén una vez destruida ahora ya está restaurada. Su Dios ya los salvó y ahora vuelven a casa. Isaías, su profeta, les aseguró que el Dios amoroso los cuidó, los confortó, como una madre, dándoles abundantes causas para su regocijo. Pero, ¿cómo viajaron? La comunidad de Israel iba junta, apoyándose unos a los otros, aunque el camino debió de haber sido difícil para ellos. Su fe y confianza en la misericordia del Dios de Israel los sostenía.

CROSS ROADS

Now imagine the seventy-two disciples being sent to preach the Kingdom and to prepare people for the Good News of Jesus coming into their lives. No food, no money, no luggage, no reservations—just their faith in Jesus and their optimistic enthusiasm for God's Kingdom. The Good Shepherd had sent his “lambs” into the world of wolves, with instructions to help them deal with rejection and hardship.

Can you imagine the disciples returning from their mission, excited, heady with the successes they experienced on the road? Although they attributed their deeds to the power of the name of Jesus, they were obviously bragging about what they accomplished. In today's second reading, Paul is writing to the community of Galatia, reminding them that the only appropriate boast is in the cross of Jesus Christ.

Expecting the cross, we might find that our fellow laborers in the fields have dwindled in number. So we pray for companions on our own journeys to walk with us in faithful joy.

CRUCE DE CAMINOS

Ahora imagina a los setenta y dos discípulos siendo enviados a predicar el Reino y a preparar a las personas por la Buena Nueva de que Jesús venía a sus vidas. Sin comida, sin dinero, sin equipaje, sin reservaciones, solo su fe en Jesús y su entusiasmo optimista por el Reino de Dios. El Buen Pastor había enviado a sus “ovejas” a un mundo con lobos, con instrucciones para ayudarlos a enfrentar el rechazo y la dificultad.

¿Puedes imaginar a los discípulos regresar de su misión, contentos y emocionados con el éxito que tuvieron en el camino? Aunque atribuyeron sus obras al poder del nombre de Jesús, estaban jactándose de lo que lograron. En la segunda lectura de hoy, Pablo escribe a la comunidad de los gálatas, recordándoles que de lo único por lo que deben alegrarse es en la cruz de Jesucristo.

Esperando la cruz, podríamos encontrar que nuestros compañeros trabajadores en los campos han disminuido. Así que rezamos por compañeros en nuestros propios caminos para caminar con nosotros con una alegría fiel.
