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## SCRIPTURE READINGS

Deuteronomy 30:10-14 (105C)  
Psalm 69:14, 17, 30-31, 33-34, 36, 37  
Colossians 1:15-20  
Luke 10:25-37

**Our Neighbor**

This Sunday we have the opportunity to meditate on a very special Gospel for two reasons; the first reason is that God, through his Word, tells us a beautiful story. We could say that he shows us all his art and that the *"Parable of the Good Samaritan"* is a beautiful work of literature with all its content: the presentation, the way in which the event is narrated, the terrible event that took place and the final outcome. And we see that not everything ends there, it is not simply telling a story, the ending concludes with a question; the question that Jesus asks the teacher of the law. The second reason, the object of our meditation is the message that Jesus gives to our neighbor, which leaves us the teaching that we should practice as true Christians.

The master of the law knew what he should do to *"have eternal life"* and answered perfectly. Jesus confirmed that he was right and that is why he encourages him to do what he himself said. But the question he asks our Lord: *"And who is my neighbor?"* shows that he did not understand very well what he had answered. He understood very well what his relationship with God meant, but he did not understand what his relationship with his neighbor consisted of.

Jesus, as in so many other opportunities in which the Pharisees and teachers of the law wanted to put him to the test, tempt him with insidious questions or trap him, takes the opportunity to teach, to reflect, and to draw conclusions using reason in an attempt to illuminate the mind of the teacher of the law.

The story of a man fallen into disgrace, before whom different characters passed with indifference until one had compassion for him, is to understand that the first attitude you have to have with your neighbor is charity ... you have to love him. Those who passed by did not love him.

We must love God above all things, but that does not withhold us from loving *"your neighbor as yourself"*. Loving ourselves does not cost much, because we do it naturally when we respect our existence and try to live according to those things that do us good both spiritually and physically. In the same way, that love that we have and that is legitimate as children and creatures of God, must be turned toward our neighbor. If for ourselves we seek the good and the best, we must do the same with our neighbor both spiritually and materially.

Like the man in the parable who went down from Jerusalem to Jericho, we also experience in our existence the assaults of life, the blows that circumstances give us, the things that shake our being, that make us uneasy, that take away our peace, but let us think that the Good Samaritan always comes to us, Jesus, who has compassion for us, heals us, takes care of us and has left us at an inn for our refuge: the Church.

## Nuestro Próximo

Este domingo tenemos la oportunidad de meditar un Evangelio muy especial por dos razones. La primera de ellas es que Dios, a través de su Palabra, nos cuenta una bellísima historia, podríamos decir que nos muestra todo su arte y que la "Parábola del Buen Samaritano" es una hermosa obra de literatura con todo su contenido: la presentación, la manera en que está narrado el hecho, el terrible hecho acontecido y el desenlace final. Y vemos que no todo termina allí, no es simplemente contar una historia, el final concluye con una pregunta, la pregunta que Jesús le hace al maestro de la ley.

La segunda razón que debe ser objeto de nuestra meditación, por supuesto, es el mensaje que da Jesús respecto al prójimo, que justamente nos deja la enseñanza que debemos practicar como verdaderos cristianos.

El maestro de la ley sabía que es lo que debía hacer para "tener la vida eterna" y contestó perfectamente. Jesús confirmó que estaba en lo correcto y por eso lo alienta a hacer eso que él mismo dijo. Pero la pregunta que le hace al Señor: "Y ¿quién es mi prójimo?" muestra que no entendía muy bien lo que había contestado. Quizás algunas cosas sí, pero aquella respecto al "prójimo", evidentemente no. Entendía muy bien todo lo que significaba su relación con Dios, pero no entendía en qué consistía su relación con el prójimo.

Jesús, como en otras tantas oportunidades en que los fariseos y maestros de la ley querían ponerlo a prueba, tentarlo con preguntas insidiosas o tenderle trampas, aprovecha la ocasión para enseñar, y no sólo eso, sino para hacer reflexionar, para sacar conclusiones utilizando el razonamiento y busca iluminar la mente del maestro de la ley.

La historia de ese hombre caído en desgracia, ante quien pasaban con indiferencia distintos personajes hasta que llegó uno que tuvo compasión de él, es para que entienda que la primera actitud que hay que tener con el prójimo es la caridad... hay que amarlo. Los que pasaron de largo no lo amaban.

Debemos amar a Dios en primer lugar y por sobre todas las cosas, pero eso no priva de amar "a tu prójimo como a ti mismo". Amarnos a nosotros mismos no nos cuesta mucho, pues lo hacemos naturalmente cuando respetamos nuestra existencia y tratamos de vivir según aquellas cosas que nos hacen bien, espiritual y materialmente. De la misma manera, ese amor que nos tenemos y que es legítimo como hijos y criaturas de Dios, debe volcarse en nuestro prójimo. Si para nosotros buscamos lo bueno y lo mejor, debemos hacer lo mismo con nuestro prójimo tanto en lo espiritual como en lo material.

En nuestra existencia muchas veces experimentamos, como ese hombre de la parábola que bajaba de Jerusalén a Jericó, los asaltos de la vida, los golpes que las circunstancias nos dan, las cosas que sacuden nuestro ser, que nos intranquilizan, que nos quitan la paz, pero pensemos que siempre acude a nosotros el Buen Samaritano, Jesús, que tiene compasión de nosotros, nos cura, nos cuida y nos ha dejado una posada para nuestro refugio: la Iglesia.

## **Statement from Bishop Oscar Cantú and the Diocese of San José**

The Diocese of San Jose has learned that State Senator Jerry Hill has withdrawn his bill, SB 360, regarding the Seal of Confession, from the California Assembly Public Safety Committee, just a day before its scheduled hearings.

I want to thank the many parishioners who made their voices heard to their Assembly representatives in opposition to SB 360, as it violates the free practice of our faith. Our priests and I are grateful that we do not have to be subject to prosecution by law for being faithful to the privacy of Confession. The Seal of Confession is sacred and should not be broken.

There is strong evidence that training priests, teachers, staff, parents, and children to recognize suspicious behavior, report any and all instances of abuse and neglect, and prioritize the safety of children is resulting in the dramatic increase of safe spaces for children and families.

The Church in San José continues to be vigilant in creating an environment which is safe and nurturing for all. The reporting requirements and protections for clergy members are already identical to the requirements and protections for other mandated reporters, except for the provision exempting information acquired during a Confession.

The Diocese of San Jose conducts background checks and requires recertification training every three years for diocesan bishops, priests, deacons, employees, and volunteers. Since 2002, approximately 52,500 adults in the Diocese have been trained to recognize and report child abuse. Working together to be vigilant and keep children safe, our Catholic community is committed to creating a safe environment for all children and families.

**Maria Domenica De Sanctis Merlitti**  
**September 24, 1936 - June 28, 2019**

Long-time parishioner Maria Merlitti passed away on Friday, June 28th after a long struggle with cancer. I first met Maria when I came to St. Athanasius back in the summer of 1992 when Fr. John Cooper was our Pastor. I was drawn to her because she reminded me of my Italian aunts: a big smile, full of life and energy. She was very devoted to her husband Joe and to her two children; Valerie and Joseph and her grandson Nicholas. Because of her heavy Italian accent, I assumed Maria was a recent immigrant to the United States but I later found out this was not the case. She loved her native language and Italian culture - the food, the art, the beauty – what’s not to love! She was a talented artist, a great cook and a caring child-care provider for my 2 daughters before they started attending pre-school. She loved children and took care of many babies and preschooler’s in the Monta Loma neighborhood for several years. What most impressed me about Maria was her devotion to our Catholic faith. Maria sang in the 10:30am Mass choir for a number of years and also served as a Eucharistic Minister until she became ill a couple of years ago. She regularly attended the 9:00am daily Mass and at other times, could be found praying before the Blessed Sacrament in the rectory chapel. She also used her sewing skills to make and repair altar linens, decorative banners and sacred vestments. She will be greatly missed by her friends and family but I am confident that she has not forgotten our parish and all of us, in her prayers from heaven. May she rest in the peace of Christ!
