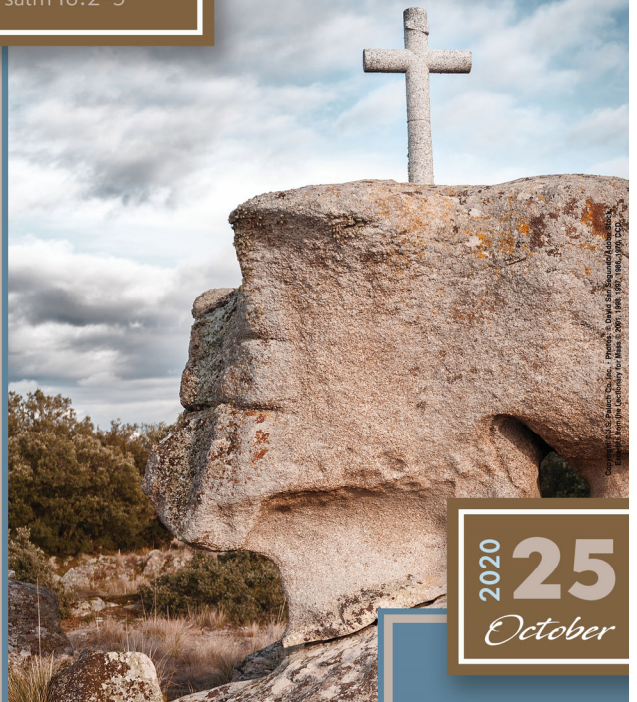

SAINT ATHANASIUS

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The secret to our Sunday readings lies in today's Gospel Acclamation: "Whoever loves me will keep my word, says the Lord, and my Father will love him and we will come to him" (John 14:23). That single line from John's Gospel gets right to the heart of today's readings, reminding us of the intimate relationship between the law ("keeping God's word") and God's love. While human nature tends to resist burdensome rules, our readings show us the wisdom of God's plan that guides us with the rule of law. In Exodus, the law boldly prevents injustice, protecting the most vulnerable members of society. In Thessalonians, the law elevates our behavior and saves us from "the coming wrath." In Matthew's Gospel, the law swaddles us in God's compassion. In loving God, neighbor, and self, we imitate God and bring blessing to a fractured world.

THE RULE OF LAW

Anyone who has read the Pentateuch (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy) from beginning to end appreciates the massive influence of the law on our ancestors in faith. In fact, what Christians call the Pentateuch (Greek for "five books"), Jewish tradition calls the Torah ("teaching" or "law"). In the first five books of the Bible, there is no escaping the law, its meticulous detail and relentless regulations, decrees, and pronouncements from God to Moses and Aaron. Also common in these books, alas, are stories of God's chosen people going astray. The predominance of the law reminds us that we are creatures with a tendency to sin; God provides the law to us beloved children to regulate our behavior and help us live more peacefully on earth.

IMITATING GOD

Laws would be entirely unnecessary if we lived perfect lives. As we know all too well, however, we often fall short of the good intentions that we cherish in our hearts. Perhaps the law would even be unnecessary if we lived alone, isolated from other people. After all, what hermit in a cave actually needs a commandment to charge no interest on a loan? But God's design for humanity includes togetherness. And when we live together, we tend to step on each other's toes. Thank God for laws that help us to live in community with justice and compassion.

Underlying every one of God's laws is an eternal longing for fairness and fullness. What's more, God's own self—a vibrant community of Father, Son, and Spirit—reveals the deep joy of living in peace with self and neighbor. The Trinitarian nature of God—three persons in one God—astonishes us with its commitment to fruitful love. Love is gratuitous and lavish, constantly producing and giving of itself. The more generously we love God, self, and neighbor, the more we will know that, as Saint Paul says, "love is the fulfillment of the law" (Romans 13:10).

2020 October Count is Here!

Mandated by the Diocese of San Jose, the annual October Count is here. At all Masses during the month of October, our ushers will conduct a count of our Mass attendance. All results will be sent to the Diocese of San Jose.

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

With regard to the election, I wish to point out the bishops' teaching regarding "intrinsic evils" when voting. I point us to the following two paragraphs from the US bishops' document, *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*:

"Catholics often face **difficult choices** about how to vote. This is why it is so important to vote according to a well-formed conscience that perceives the proper relationship among moral goods. A Catholic cannot vote for a candidate who favors a policy promoting an intrinsically evil act, such as abortion, euthanasia, assisted suicide, deliberately subjecting workers or the poor to subhuman living conditions, redefining marriage in ways that violate its essential meaning, or racist behavior, if the voter's intent is to support that position. In such cases, a Catholic would be guilty of formal cooperation in grave evil. At the same time, a voter should not use a candidate's opposition to an intrinsic evil to justify indifference or inattentiveness to other important moral issues involving human life and dignity.

"There may be times when a Catholic who rejects a candidate's unacceptable position even on policies promoting an **intrinsically evil act** may reasonably decide to vote for that candidate for other morally grave reasons. Voting in this way would be permissible only for truly grave moral reasons, not to advance narrow interests or partisan preferences or to ignore a fundamental moral evil" (FCFC 34-35).

Be assured of my prayers for you as you participate in the democratic process. May we work to build a more just and peaceful world!

EL ESTADO DE DERECHO

Cualquiera que haya leído el Pentateuco (Génesis, Éxodo, Levítico, Números y Deuteronomio) de principio a fin aprecia la enorme influencia de la ley en nuestros antepasados en la fe. De hecho, lo que los cristianos llaman el Pentateuco (en griego “cinco libros”), la tradición judía lo llama la Torá (“enseñanza” o “ley”). En los primeros cinco libros de la Biblia no hay escapatoria de la ley, su meticuloso detalle, regulaciones implacables, decretos y pronunciamientos de Dios a Moisés y a Aarón. También algo común en estos libros, por desgracia, son las historias del pueblo elegido de Dios que se extravía. El predominio de la ley nos recuerda que somos criaturas con tendencia a pecar; Dios nos proporciona la ley a nosotros, hijos amados, para regular nuestro comportamiento y ayudarnos a vivir más pacíficamente en la tierra.

IMITANDO A DIOS

Las leyes serían totalmente innecesarias si viviéramos vidas perfectas. Sin embargo, como muy bien lo sabemos, a menudo nos quedamos cortos de las buenas intenciones que albergamos en nuestros corazones. Quizás la ley sería incluso innecesaria si viviéramos solos, aislados de otras personas. Después de todo, ¿qué ermitaño en una cueva necesita un mandamiento para no cobrar intereses en un préstamo? Pero el diseño de Dios para la humanidad incluye la unión. Y cuando vivimos juntos, tendemos a pisarnos los pies unos a otros. Gracias a Dios por las leyes que nos ayudan a vivir en comunidad con justicia y compasión. Detrás de cada una de las leyes de Dios hay un eterno anhelo por la justicia y la plenitud. Lo que, es más, Dios mismo, una vibrante comunidad de Padre, Hijo y Espíritu, revela la profunda alegría de vivir en paz con uno mismo y con el prójimo. La naturaleza trinitaria de Dios, tres personas en un solo Dios, nos asombra con su compromiso de amor fructífero. El amor es gratuito y abundante, produciéndose constantemente y dándose a sí mismo. Cuanto amemos más generosamente a Dios, a nosotros mismos y al prójimo, más sabremos que, como san Pablo dice, “el amor es el cumplimiento de la ley” (Romanos 13:10).

En cada sobre puede enlistar hasta 12 nombres de sus seres queridos que han fallecido y que le gustaría que recordáramos durante todas nuestras Misas a los fieles difuntos en el mes de noviembre. Una vez que usted haya completado su sobre favor de adjuntar su donación, deposite su sobre en la canasta de la colecta o entréguelo en la Oficina de la Iglesia. Los nombres de sus seres queridos ya fallecidos y enlistados en los sobres no serán mencionados individualmente, pero los sobres serán colocados en el altar el día de los fieles difuntos y permanecerán ahí el resto del mes.

Hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

En relación a las elecciones, deseo señalar la enseñanza de los obispos sobre los “males intrínsecos” a la hora de votar. Me dirijo a los siguientes dos párrafos del documento de los obispos de los Estados Unidos, *Formando Conciencias para ser Ciudadanos Fieles*:

Los católicos a menudo afrontan **decisiones difíciles** sobre cómo votar. Es por esto que es tan importante votar de acuerdo con una conciencia bien formada que perciba la relación apropiada que existe entre los bienes morales. Un católico no puede votar a favor de un candidato que toma una posición a favor de algo intrínsecamente malo, como el aborto provocado, la eutanasia, el suicidio asistido, el sometimiento deliberado de los trabajadores o los pobres a condiciones de vida inhumanas, la redefinición del matrimonio en formas que violan su significado esencial, o comportamientos racistas, si la intención del votante es apoyar tal posición. En tales casos un católico sería culpable de cooperar formalmente con un mal grave. Pero al mismo tiempo, un votante no debería usar la oposición a un mal intrínseco de un candidato para justificar una indiferencia o despreocupación hacia otras cuestiones morales importantes que atañen a la vida y dignidad humana.

Puede haber ocasiones en que un católico que rechaza una posición inaceptable de un candidato incluso sobre políticas que promueven un acto **intrínsecamente malo** decida razonablemente votar a favor de ese candidato por otras razones moralmente graves. Votar de esta manera sería solamente aceptable si verdaderamente existen razones morales graves, y no para promover intereses mezquinos o las preferencias de un partido político o para ignorar un mal moral fundamental. (FCCF 34-35). Tengan la seguridad de mis oraciones por usted mientras participa en el proceso democrático. ¡Que podamos trabajar para construir un mundo más justo y pacífico!

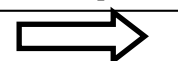
The Parish has significantly reduced its expenses in line with the decreasing collection. However, as we rely on collection to pay for these expenses, we humbly ask for your generosity.

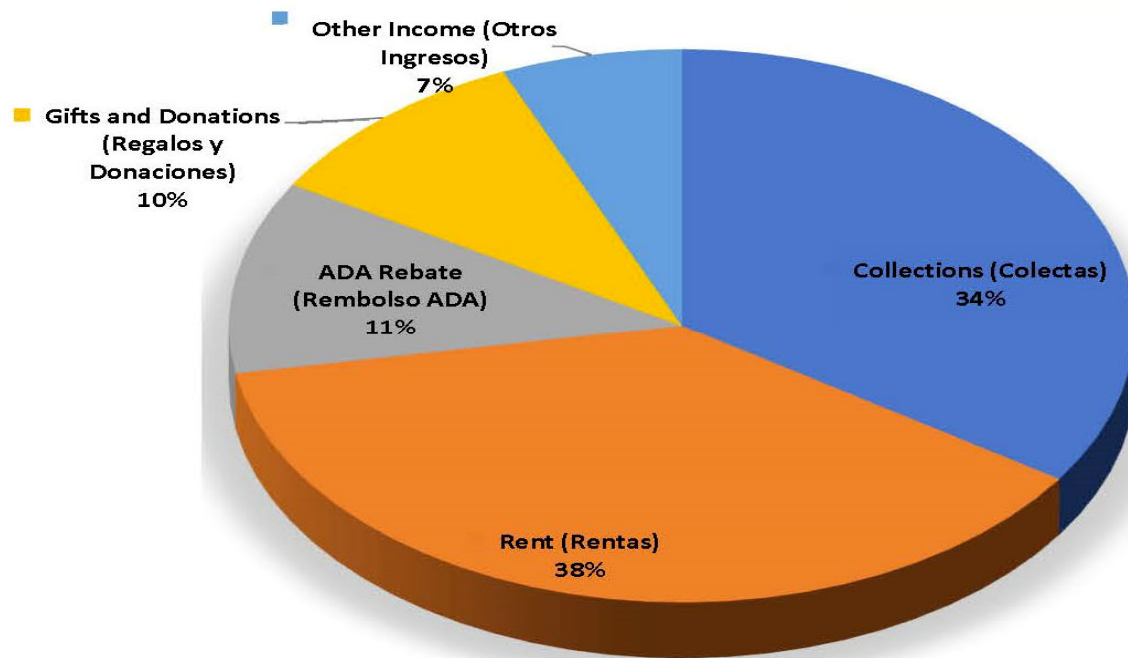
