SAINT ATHANASIUS

Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel is the conclusion of the Bread of Life discourse in John. After Jesus' continued insistence that he is the Bread of Life come down from heaven, and that his words are "Spirit and life," most of his disciples drift away. The Twelve, however, affirm their faith in Jesus, whom Simon Peter professes to "have the words of eternal life." In the first reading, Joshua and the Israelites are preparing to enter the Promised Land, and Joshua asks the people to decide which god they will follow, the LORD their God, or the gods of neighboring peoples. The Responsorial Psalm features Psalm 34, the "taste and see" psalm, that reflects the kinds of struggles the Israelites faced during their sojourn in the wilderness. In the second reading, Paul gives counsel for maintaining domestic peace and happiness.

CROSSROADS IN LIFE, THEN AND NOW

Sometimes in life we find ourselves at a crossroads, faced with an existential choice that will alter the course of our life. We are aware, at these moments, just how significant our choice will be and that there will be no going back.

In both the first reading and the Gospel we see such moments calling people to make such choices. Which god will the Israelites follow? Joshua, their leader after Moses, knows that the area around the Promised Land is occupied by other peoples, with other gods. Perhaps remembering how, after Moses had gone up Mount Sinai, the Israelites set up a golden calf to worship, Joshua worries that they may again be susceptible to such attractions. He is asking them for a commitment, and proclaims, "As for me and my household, we will serve the LORD."

WE FACE THE SAME QUESTION: CAN WE STAY WITH JESUS?

The people who were frenetically following Jesus, crossing the lake twice to pursue him, eating the bread he miraculously provided, are now puzzled by Jesus proclaiming himself as "the bread of life," and they are incredulous. They can go with him no farther, so they gradually drift away. The Twelve, however, stay with Jesus. What else could they do? Who else offers such a profound vision of human life? Peter expresses it well: "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."

Not all of our life's crossroads involve our faith, but some do. Perhaps there is someone in your parish who chose to become Catholic and is now alienated from their family; someone who is unhappy with a new pastor and wondering about looking for a different parish; someone who was especially distressed by the clergy sex abuse and prayed long and hard before deciding that she needed her parish to get through it. There may be many in your parish facing such choices, and they need our support and our prayers. In the meantime, we can hope that someday they will again experience Jesus as the Holy One of God, offering them words of eternal life.

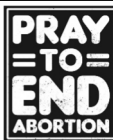

BOLETIN HISPANO

Vigésimo Primer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

El Evangelio de hoy de Juan es la conclusión del discurso del Pan de Vida. Después de la continua insistencia de que Jesús es el Pan de Vida bajado del cielo y que sus palabras son “Espíritu y vida”, la mayoría de sus discípulos se alejan. Sin embargo, los Doce afirman su fe en Jesús de quien Simón Pedro profesa que “tiene palabras de vida eterna”. En la primera lectura, Josué y los israelitas se preparan para entrar a la Tierra Prometida y, Josué pide al pueblo que decida a cuál dios seguirá, a Yahveh su Dios o a los dioses de los pueblos vecinos. El salmo responsorial presenta el salmo 34, el salmo de “gusten y vean” que muestra el tipo de luchas a las que los israelitas se enfrentaron durante su estancia en el desierto. En la segunda lectura, Pablo da consejos para mantener la paz y la felicidad en el hogar.

ENCrucIJADA EN LA VIDA, ANTES Y AHORA

A veces en la vida, nos encontramos en una encrucijada, enfrentados a una elección existencial que alterará el curso de nuestra vida. En esos momentos estamos conscientes de la importancia de nuestra elección y de que ya no hay vuelta atrás. Tanto en la primera lectura como en el Evangelio vemos que esos momentos llaman a la gente a tomar esas decisiones. ¿A qué dios seguirán los israelitas? Josué, su líder después de Moisés, sabe que la zona de la Tierra Prometida está ocupada por otros pueblos, con otros dioses. Tal vez recordando cómo, después de que Moisés subiera al monte Sinaí, los israelitas levantaron un becerro de oro para adorarlo, Josué se preocupa de que puedan ser de nuevo susceptibles a tales atracciones. Les pide un compromiso, y proclama: “En cuanto a mí y a mi casa, serviremos a Yahveh”.

NOS ENFRENTAMOS A LA MISMA PREGUNTA: ¿PODEMOS QUEDARNOS CON JESÚS?

La gente que seguía frenéticamente a Jesús, cruzando el lago dos veces para perseguirlo, comiendo el pan que él les proporcionó milagrosamente, ahora está desconcertada porque Jesús se proclama a sí mismo como “el pan de vida”, y se muestran incrédulos. No pueden ir más lejos con él y se alejan poco a poco. Sin embargo, los Doce se quedan con Jesús. ¿Qué otra cosa ellos podrían hacer? ¿Quién más ofrece una visión tan profunda de la vida humana? Pedro lo expresa bien: “Maestro, ¿a quién iremos? Tú tienes palabras de vida eterna”.

No todas las encrucijadas de nuestra vida implican nuestra fe, pero algunas sí. Tal vez haya alguien en su parroquia que eligió hacerse católico y ahora está alejado de su familia; alguien que no está contento con un nuevo párroco y se pregunta sobre la posibilidad de buscar una parroquia diferente; alguien que estuvo especialmente angustiado por los abusos sexuales del clero y rezó mucho antes de decidir que necesitaba a su parroquia para superarlo. Es posible que haya muchos en tu parroquia que se enfrentan a este tipo de decisiones, y necesitan nuestro apoyo y nuestras oraciones. Mientras tanto, podemos esperar que algún día vuelvan a experimentar a Jesús como el Santo de Dios, ofreciéndoles palabras de vida eterna.

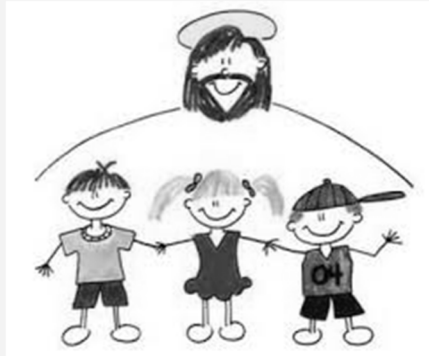
