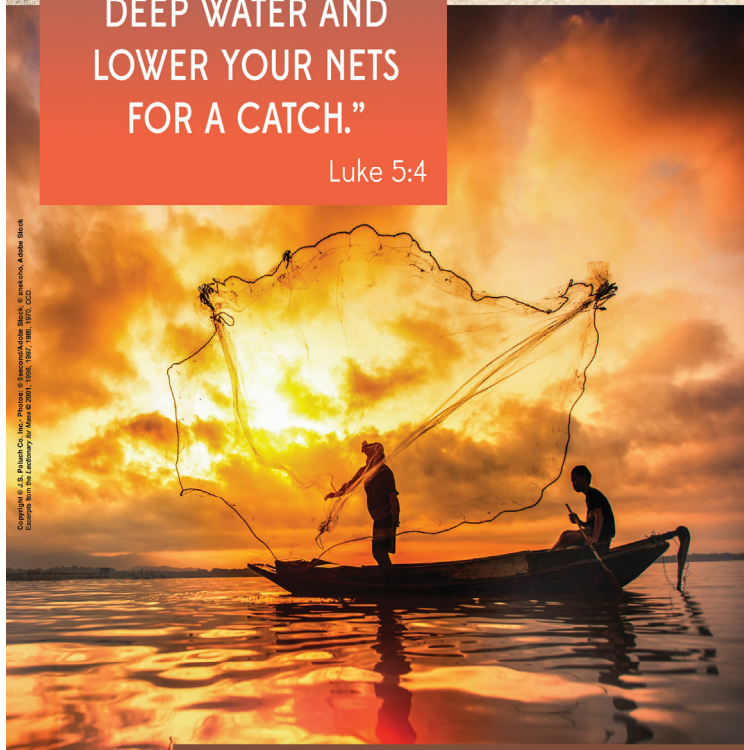

SAINT ATHANASIUS

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Isn't it comforting to know that others have struggles with low self-esteem? Today Isaiah calls himself a man with "unclean lips." Paul is "not fit to be called an apostle." Simon Peter tells Jesus (perhaps unnecessarily) "I am a sinful man." All of these may be true, but God chose these three—unclean, unfit, sinful—as important, essential messengers in the work of salvation. We all can remember this whenever we are tempted to view ourselves as unqualified for (or excuse ourselves from) sharing the Good News. Having a low opinion of ourselves isn't humility. Truth be told, it's a kind of arrogance to think that God cannot work through us. It's a good thing to be aware of and honest about our failings or limitations, but we also give glory to God by acknowledging what we are able to do, by sharing the gifts that God has granted us.

RECEIVING THE CALL

All three readings today feature what are known as the "call" stories of famous figures of our faith: Isaiah, Paul, and Simon Peter. Each story shares features common to scriptural "call" stories: First, an encounter with God or a messenger of God. Second, there is some sort of resistance, usually framed as a claim of unworthiness. Third, the one who has been called receives an assurance that they are, indeed, fit for the mission. In this way God has continued to call prophets, apostles, saints, and everyday women and men throughout time. It is unlikely that any of us will receive a "call" as dramatic as fiery angels in the temple, a booming voice from heaven striking us down, or sitting side-by-side in a boat with Jesus of Nazareth. This doesn't mean we can't, or won't, or haven't received a call from God. It may even be a "spillover" from somebody else's, the way James and John are called through Jesus giving Simon Peter his mission.

SINFUL MAN, HOLY MAN

We can likely identify with Simon Peter who, in today's Gospel passage, is really having a bad day at work. When your job is to catch fish, and you're not catching fish, it's a bad day. To top it off, he knows he is in the presence of a holy man in the person of this Jesus of Nazareth, who had just commandeered his boat to do some spontaneous preaching. As good as the preaching may have been, it surely didn't put fish in the nets. So, as he will throughout the gospel, Jesus rectifies the situation. Simon Peter knows he's not merely in the presence of a holy man, but of holiness itself, and declares his sinfulness. Nevertheless, he is commissioned for the work of the Gospel. No matter how bad our day may be going, or how incompetent we think we are, we are receiving the call. Our role in the story? Listen.

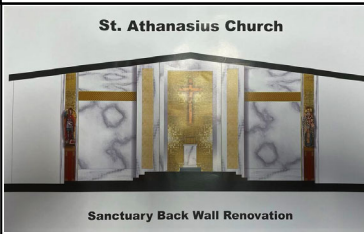

Quinto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

¿No es reconfortante saber que otros tienen problemas de baja autoestima? Hoy Isaías se llama así mismo un hombre con “labios impuros”. Pablo “no es apto para ser llamado apóstol”. Simón Pedro le dice a Jesús (quizá innecesariamente) “soy un hombre pecador”. Todo esto puede ser cierto, pero Dios eligió a estos tres –impuros, no aptos, pecadores– como mensajeros importantes y esenciales en la obra de la salvación. Todos podemos recordar esto cada vez que tengamos la tentación de vernos como no aptos para (o excusarnos de) compartir la Buena Nueva. Tener una baja opinión de nosotros mismos no es humildad. A decir verdad, es una especie de arrogancia pensar que Dios no puede actuar a través de nosotros. Es bueno ser conscientes y honestos sobre nuestros fallos o limitaciones, pero también damos gloria a Dios reconociendo lo que somos capaces de hacer, compartiendo los dones que Dios nos ha concedido.

RECIBIR EL LLAMADO


Las lecturas de hoy presentan lo que se conoce como historias del “llamado” de personajes famosos de nuestra fe: Isaías, Pablo y Simón Pedro. Cada una de las historias comparte características comunes a la historia del “llamado” de las Escrituras: en primer lugar, un encuentro con Dios o con un mensajero de Dios. En segundo lugar, hay algún tipo de resistencia, normalmente enmarcada en una afirmación de indignidad. En tercer lugar, la persona que ha sido llamada recibe la seguridad de que, efectivamente, es apta para la misión. De este modo, Dios ha seguido llamando a profetas, apóstoles, santos, hombres y mujeres comunes a lo largo del tiempo. Es poco probable que alguno de nosotros reciba un “llamado” tan dramático como la de unos ángeles ardientes en el templo, una voz atronadora desde el cielo que nos golpee, o el sentarse codo con codo en una barca con Jesús de Nazaret. Esto no significa que no podamos, o no queramos, o no hayamos recibido una llamada de Dios. Incluso puede ser un “desprendimiento” de la de otra persona, de la manera en que Santiago y Juan son llamados a través de Jesús que le da a Simón Pedro su misión.

HOMBRE PECADOR, HOMBRE SANTO

Es probable que nos identifiquemos con Simón Pedro que, en el pasaje del Evangelio de hoy, está teniendo un mal día en el trabajo. Cuando tu trabajo es pescar y no pescar, es un mal día. Para colmo, sabe que está en presencia de un hombre santo en la persona de este Jesús de Nazaret, que acaba de requisar su barca para hacer una predicación espontánea. Por muy buena que haya sido la predicación, seguramente no puso peces en las redes. Así que, como hará a lo largo del Evangelio, Jesús rectifica la situación. Simón Pedro sabe que no está simplemente en presencia de un hombre santo, sino de la santidad misma, y declara su pecaminosidad. Sin embargo, se le encarga la obra del Evangelio. No importa lo mal que nos vaya el día, o lo incompetentes que nos creamos, estamos recibiendo el llamado. ¿Nuestro papel en la historia? Escuchar.
