SAINT ATHANASIUS

Easter Sunday

The story of Easter reveals that the world has begun a new day. The darkness of the Crucifixion has opened into the light of Easter. Like the dawn that gradually opened to the disciples on the first Easter morning, we slowly begin to see what the light of faith reveals. Death will not have the final word, because Christ is risen and we will share in his resurrection. Injustice and suffering will not continue forever, because God's victory over sin has begun, and will be completed when Christ returns. Evil has met its match, because through Jesus, God has brought a new energy into the world. This energy can be found in followers of Christ who are free to love, empowered by the Spirit to embrace everyone, without exception. May we bear the light of Christ, with humility and courage, into our troubled world.

RE-INTERPRETING OUR WORLD

Our Gospel reading from John captures the initial confusion of Jesus' followers on Easter morning. Mary thinks the body has been stolen, and the two disciples see an empty tomb, but do not understand. We can sympathize with their initial misreading, as they are interpreting what happened within how they understand the way the world works: Jesus was crushed by the authorities—end of story. Jesus' later appearances to them will dramatically shift their perception of God, the world, and themselves.

This work of re-interpreting the world in light of the death and resurrection of Jesus continues today. In his passion and death, Jesus showed that true power, God's power, emerges through humility and forgiveness. We join in the death and resurrection of Jesus when we surrender the attractions of power, status, and comfort, and embrace non-violence, service, and care for the suffering. The path to bringing peace and goodness to the world is not through seeking control, but through sacrificial love.

BOTH PETER AND CORNELIUS

Peter's speech in today's passage from Acts summarizes the ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus. The speech occurs within his encounter with Cornelius, a Roman centurion and his household. We can perhaps imagine being Cornelius, led by God to hear the story of Jesus. Or we can imagine being Peter, led by the Spirit to share the Good News of Jesus. As followers of Christ, we are called to embrace both, in our imaginations and our lives.

We are continually called to hear the story of Jesus. We know that God's Good News has entered us, but also know that it has not. There is much in our hearts that needs conversion and begs for God's mercy, so we always seek God's challenging and healing word. We are also continually called to share the story of Jesus, sometimes directly but more often in our actions. Our lives can speak of God's love, healing and encouraging others. We are both Peter and Cornelius.

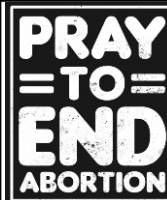

- Enter the secure PIN that the system texts you.

- To text a donation after the one-time registration, you can give immediately without having to re-enter any of your information.

Domingo de Pascua

La historia de la Pascua revela que el mundo ha comenzado un nuevo día. La oscuridad de la Crucifixión se ha abierto a la luz de la Pascua. Como el amanecer que se abrió poco a poco a los discípulos en la primera mañana de Pascua, empezamos a ver lentamente lo que revela la luz de la fe. La muerte no tendrá la última palabra, porque Cristo ha resucitado y nosotros compartiremos su resurrección. La injusticia y el sufrimiento no continuarán para siempre, porque la victoria de Dios sobre el pecado ha comenzado, y se completará cuando Cristo regrese. El mal ha encontrado su rival, porque a través de Jesús, Dios ha traído una nueva energía al mundo. Esta energía puede encontrarse en los seguidores de Cristo que son libres para amar, facultados por el Espíritu para abrazar a todos, sin excepción. Que podamos llevar la luz de Cristo, con humildad y valentía, a nuestro mundo agitado.

REINTERPRETAR NUESTRO MUNDO

Nuestra lectura del Evangelio de Juan capta la confusión inicial de los seguidores de Jesús en la mañana de Pascua. María cree que el cuerpo ha sido robado, y los dos discípulos ven una tumba vacía, pero no lo entienden. Podemos simpatizar con su mala interpretación inicial, ya que están interpretando lo sucedido dentro de su forma de entender el funcionamiento del mundo: Jesús fue aplastado por las autoridades—fin de la historia. Las apariciones posteriores de Jesús cambiarán radicalmente su percepción de Dios, del mundo y de ellos mismos.

Este trabajo de reinterpretación del mundo a la luz de la muerte y resurrección de Jesús continúa hoy. En su pasión y muerte, Jesús mostró que el verdadero poder, el poder de Dios, surge a través de la humildad y el perdón. Nos unimos a la muerte y resurrección de Jesús cuando renunciamos a los atractivos del poder, el estatus y la comodidad, y abrazamos la no violencia, el servicio y la atención a los que sufren. El camino para traer la paz y la bondad al mundo no pasa por buscar el control, sino por el amor sacrificado.

PEDRO Y CORNELIO

El discurso de Pedro en el pasaje de hoy de los Hechos resume el ministerio, la muerte y la resurrección de Jesús. El discurso se produce en el marco de su encuentro con Cornelio, un centurión romano y su familia. Podemos imaginarnos que somos Cornelio, guiado por Dios para escuchar la historia de Jesús. O podemos imaginarnos siendo Pedro, guiado por el Espíritu para compartir la Buena Nueva de Jesús. Como seguidores de Cristo, estamos llamados a abrazar ambas cosas, en nuestra imaginación y en nuestra vida.

Estamos continuamente llamados a escuchar la historia de Jesús. Sabemos que la Buena Nueva de Dios ha entrado en nosotros, pero también sabemos que no lo ha hecho. Hay mucho en nuestros corazones que necesita la conversión y pide la misericordia de Dios, por lo que siempre buscamos la palabra desafiante y sanadora de Dios. También estamos continuamente llamados a compartir la historia de Jesús, a veces directamente, pero más a menudo en nuestras acciones. Nuestras vidas pueden hablar del amor de Dios, sanando y animando a los demás. Somos tanto Pedro como Cornelio.

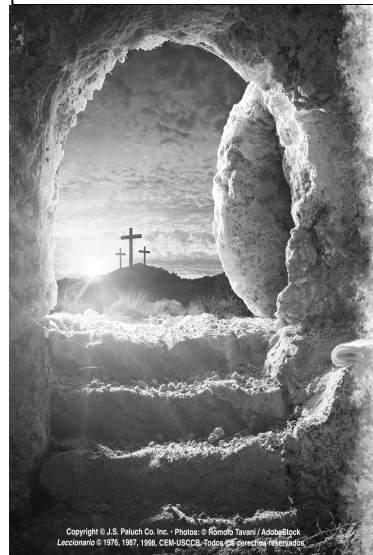
